Demonstrative adjectives and pronouns

- ◆ These adjectives and pronouns are used to place emphasis on a noun. For example, if I ask you to pass me a magazine, you might say: Which magazine? This one? That one? That one way over there? By using demonstrative adjectives and pronouns, we can better explain the noun.
- ◆ A helpful way to remember the demonstrative adjectives in Spanish is by memorizing this saying:

This and these both have **T's**; That and those don't.

(The Spanish words for this and these have t's, but that and those don't.)

- ◆ Another helpful hint is to think of:

aquí

allí

allá

este/esta

ese/esa

aquel/aquella

estos/estas

esos/esas

aquellos/aquellas

here/close by

there/near by

over there/farther away
